

Jason T. Detko

Deputy Assistant Administrator for Procurement, Agency Procurement Ombudsman and Competition Advocate, NASA



Jason Detko is the Deputy Assistant Administrator for Procurement at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA). In this role, he shares responsibility for providing senior executive leadership and oversight of NASA's procurement functions, coordinating, reviewing, evaluating, and ensuring the timeliness and effectiveness of the full spectrum of NASA procurement activities to an acquisition workforce of more than 4,000 personnel. Mr. Detko also serves as the Agency's Procurement Ombudsman and Competition Advocate.

Mr. Detko previously served as the Director of the Office of Procurement at NASA's Marshall Space Flight Center in Huntsville, Alabama. There he oversaw more than 140 civil service and contract employees and supervises work on more than 500 active contracts, grants and cooperative agreements. Mr. Detko was responsible for planning and directing the execution of all Marshall procurements with responsibility for a range of diverse multi-program and institutional activities.

Mr. Detko served in several key leadership positions, including the Director of Contracting Operations for Headquarters, Army Contracting Command, Redstone Arsenal, in Huntsville, Alabama, where he provided guidance on contract policy, e-commerce and business analytics, management assessment and field support to the command's subordinate units. During this assignment, he was Interim Executive Director for Services Acquisitions under the Deputy Assistant Secretary of the Army for Procurement. He also was Deputy Director of Contracting Operations and Chief of the Execution and Systems Contracting Support Division, and Policy Chief with the Army Contracting Command.

Prior to his positions with the Army Contracting Command, Mr. Detko was Chief of the Business Operations Branch at the Army Corps of Engineers Engineering and Support Center in Huntsville. He was Director of Contracting for the Miami Regional Contracting Office, a component of the Expeditionary Contracting Command. He served on staff at Headquarters, Army Materiel Command and Headquarters, Air Force Materiel Command, and was a Contracting Officer and Team Leader at Buckley Air Force Base in Aurora, Colorado.

In 1992, Mr. Detko began his government career as an active-duty member of the U.S. Air Force. After nine years with the Air Force, he held various leadership positions in the private sector and later with both the Air Force and Army as a civil servant.

Mr. Detko earned his bachelor's degree in business administration from Wayland Baptist University in Plainview, Texas, and his master's degree, in business administration, from American Graduate University in Covina, California. He holds Defense Acquisition Workforce Improvement Act Level III certification in contracting and has previously held unlimited Contracting Officer's Warrants. He is the recipient of the Air Force Commendation Medal, the Air Force Achievement Medal, the Army Commander's Award for Civilian Service and the Army Superior Civilian Service Award.

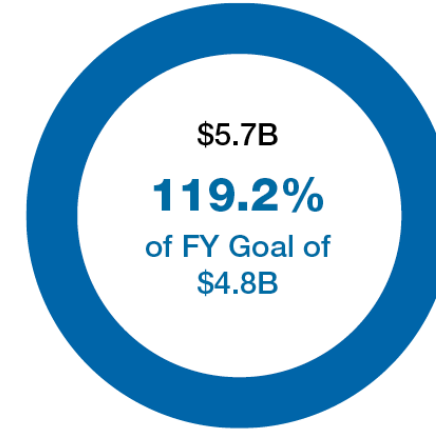

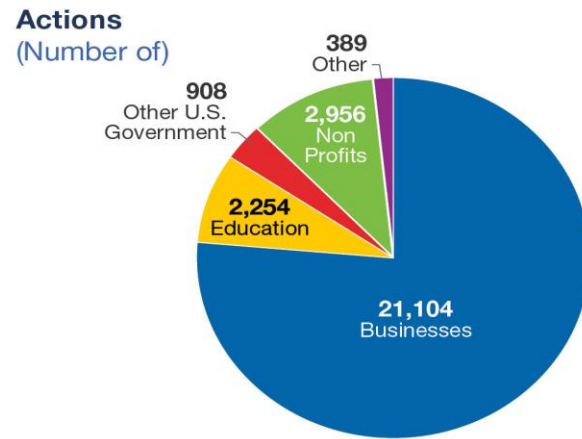
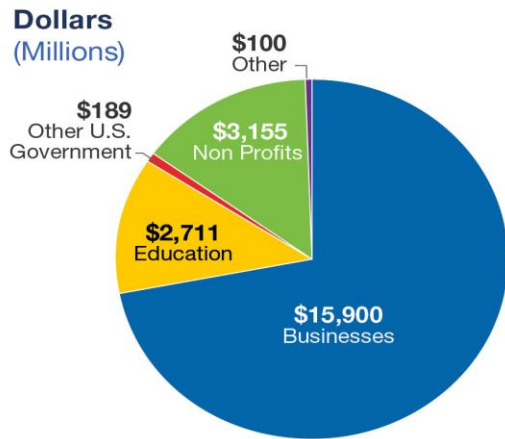
NASA's procurements totaled over **\$19.2 billion**.

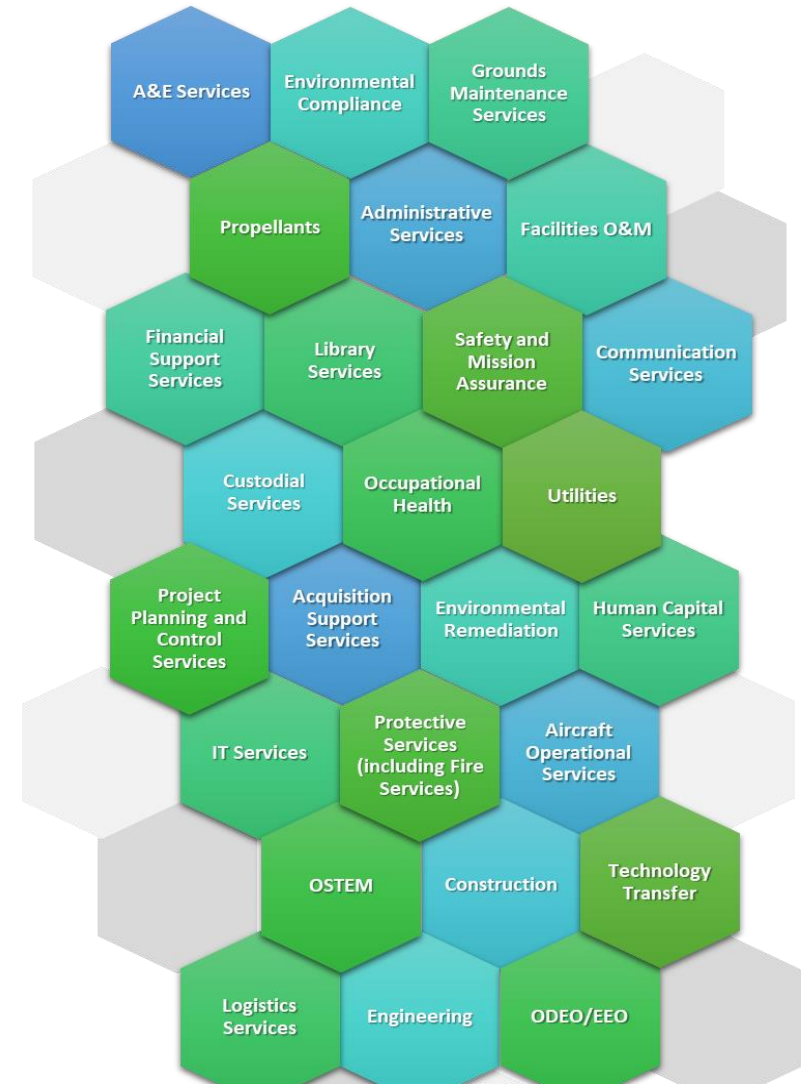

Product Service Lines (PSLs)



- ❖ On Oct. 1, 2019, the Office of Procurement began implementation of a new enterprise operating model to optimize the Agency's ability to explore and execute innovative, effective, and efficient business solutions and capabilities.
- ❖ Agency enterprise requirements and procurement strategies were developed to meet the NASA's evolving and dynamic needs and procurement portfolios were identified as Product Service Lines (PSLs).
- ❖ Each of the PSLs have designated buying locations and a dedicated Procurement Portfolio Manager (PPM) and Enterprise Requirements Manager (ERM).
- ❖ For the PSLs listed below, PPMs and ERMs will share a "Deep Dive" of the PSL structure, core requirements, acquisition strategy, and current status:
 - ❖ Communication Services
 - ❖ Financial Support Services
 - ❖ Human Capital
 - ❖ Logistics
 - ❖ Protective Services
 - ❖ Administrative Services
 - ❖ Construction
 - ❖ Engineering
 - ❖ IT Services
- ❖ The Office of Procurement will also provide an informational overview of the remaining PSLs.

1. **Pre-award** – Increased Outreach and Targeted Market Research.
2. **Award** - Increase Awards to and Partnerships with members of Underserved Community (SDBs, Ability One Contractors, HBCUs/MSIs and more)
